



Keys to Create Magical Relationships

Sounds great-but is magic real? And what *is* a magical relationship?

A magical relationship is not only real, but your divine birthright. All relationships founded upon a strong connection to divine love will yield happy, harmonious, healthy, and intimate relationships. In this report it is my joy to share one of the most rewarding secrets that my spiritual teacher gave me-how to have magical relationships. These principles have worked for me, thousands of others, and they will work for you too. So, thank you for taking the time to read and discover how to have more love and intimacy and creating the magical relationships that you deserve.

The quality of our relationships is directly related to the quality of our lives. Relationships are not only with people, but with God, money, nature, and everything that exists. Without people we can't have relationships, and the quality of our relationships is going to be determined by the quality of people we attract to us. In turn, the quality of people we attract into our lives is a reflection of who we are and who we want to be. If we want to attract loving people, we should start by being loving ourselves.

Key #1: Attract loving people by being loving to yourself.

Take for example my relationship with my spiritual guide Sidi. When I'm with him, he reflects back to me not only my own potential, but I can also see the greatness that human beings can aspire to. I can taste the Divine through his heart, and the unconditional love that he emits to every human being is something I aspire to and how I want to express myself. Sidi's ability to embrace everyone and everything without judgment or separation shows me that it's possible for a person in human form to live and walk in total awareness. It also shows me how important it is to give myself this same kind of unconditional love.

Along these lines, D.H. Lawrence wrote a beautiful poem called "Search for Love" that goes like this:

*Those that go
searching for love
never find love.*

*They only make manifest
their own lovelessness.*

*Only the loving find love,
and they never have to seek for it.*

The best way I know of to find a good partner is to *be* a good partner. This is based on the principle that the love you give is the love you get.

Experiencing this in a real and tangible manner is, for me, more powerful than reading about it. As Sidi accepts me completely and I experience this unconditional love, I am shown that I can express the same type of love to my friends and family.

Key #2: Intention is a verb.

My experience has taught me that people treat those in their work lives in the same manner they treat individuals in their private lives. In *Conversations with God*, by Neale Donald Walsch, he mentions how we must actually act out intent to directly experience a feeling. Once the thought or feeling of loving others gets acted out and manifests in loving ways, the reality is experienced firsthand. Otherwise, it's just a concept.

I often *intend* to do more things with my kids, but many times I get caught up in something and I procrastinate. I think about them all the time, and I am always full of very loving thoughts and great intentions, so in my mind I'm a good father and take great care of them. The reality is that I could do a lot more with them and be a lot more present, rather than just having good intentions.

This same tendency can be seen in my relationship with those I work with. I think about them a lot, am very grateful to have them in my life, yet I don't actually spend time doing things with them because I'm always busy doing something else. I can rationalize by saying that this helps create strong, individual leaders who don't get co-dependent, but that isn't the point.

**The point is that it takes more than good intentions to make a vision become a reality.
Action steps need to be taken.**

During many years of struggle with the darkness within me, I became an expert at feeling sorry for myself. Looking back, I can see now how the attitudes I kept choosing created the atmosphere in which I lived. Change seemed impossible because I didn't know how to change my *attitude*.

Due to a seemingly casual encounter that my ex-wife, Nathalie, had in a market one day, I ended up working with a shaman and healer named Martine Practel. I don't remember exactly how it happened but, I found myself sitting in Martine's home, which precipitated dramatic changes in my life. Martine, besides becoming one of my closest friends, had a profound effect on my spiritual life and thus the rest of my existence. One thing I learned is that it isn't only the encounter that matters, but whether or not some action is taken. Wayne Gretzky, the hockey player, once said, "I missed every shot I never took." We can't expect to score a lot of goals if we never attempt a shot in the first place.

Key # 3: We need action in addition to thought to manifest something concrete.

Relationships are not about obligations; they're about opportunities. When we are with other people, we have an opportunity to experience ourselves in relation to these individuals. My spiritual guide, Sidi, shared a saying with me that goes like this: "I was a hidden treasure that longed to be known, so I drew all of the creation out of myself in order to know Myself." So even God uses relationships to know Himself. He created something out of Himself to be able to look at and experience Himself.

Our life is made up of all kinds of relationships. The quality of our health is determined by how one part of our body relates to another. When one part becomes dysfunctional, other parts are severely affected. If we lose our sight, our hearing improves; if one muscle grows weak, we compensate by developing another muscle.

Key #4: Personal growth builds healthier relationships.

In our personal relationships, unless we grow into multifaceted individuals, our relationships will stagnate. The more we grow personally and the more we learn to nourish ourselves, the more we can nourish others. And the more we reach out to help others, the more we help ourselves and the more we grow.

Early in my career as a photographer, I had a lot of difficulty giving directions to models in a studio setting. One night after a session when the studio was empty, I went out on a set with just a white paper as a backdrop and tried to work out a few poses. I really felt uncomfortable, and from that day on I had a lot more patience with, and understanding for, the models when I put them in similar situations.

The same goes for my organization now. I like to personally try everything that I suggest to others so that I can empathize with all the challenges they might encounter. The best way to build something is to choose an action that you're passionate about, and the more passion you have, the less resistance you will experience.

This is also true in our personal lives. The more passion we bring to our relationships, the more excitement there will be, and the energy will flow through us. For me, the most important relationship in my life is with God. This is the basis on which I build everything, and it is here that I find the qualities that I like to express—when I am alone and when I am with others.

Key #5: Magical relationships begin with our relationship to the Divine.

We might have different bodies, but we are all created from the same essence, and this essence is forever around us, embracing us, and permeating our very beings. If we are to find peace in our lives, it will benefit us to act in harmony with this essence. Some call this essence God, others call it some other name. If we are to live as an extension of our Creator, then we should love in the same way, with the same unconditional love—loving everyone and everything without separation of any kind.

If we are all part of the same emotion, every time I hurt you, I am also hurting myself. Every time I deceive you, I deceive myself. As we are all one heart, everything I feel, you feel. As we grow in

awareness and expand our consciousness, we are able to know this in a more tangible way. We are connected to every person who makes a breakthrough of any kind because we all swim in the same ocean of love. And when someone suffers, we are also part of this suffering. The masters of this world are able to love both the fire and the garden with the same equanimity because they know they are of the same essence.

When Gandhi showed the world the power of nonviolence, we all felt this power with him; and as hundreds of thousands of people felt free, we tasted freedom. We cannot separate ourselves from the truth of this unity. We can forget it, and we can remain unconscious to this knowing, but the truth still stays the truth.

By ignoring something, you are certainly able to diminish its hold over you, but you can't stop time by ignoring it. When you go to sleep, you still wake up later.

Our most important relationship is the one we have with ourselves, and with our source of creation. Whatever feelings we have about ourselves will be the same as those we have about others. And when we have faith in our own divinity, we are able to experience this divinity in others.

Key #6: When we trust ourselves, we are able to trust others.

When my life appeared to fall apart, I questioned my faith. I asked many questions of God, but I couldn't hear any answers and my heart seemed unable to experience love. I would pray and feel disconnected. Whatever I tried didn't feel good, and I lived in fear. I no longer trusted myself, so I was unable to trust others. I was obsessed with my problems, and I constantly regarded myself as a victim. I had spent my life learning how to focus energy, so I was very good at playing the victim role.

As a photographer, I would often shut out the world around me except for what I saw through a small aperture in my camera. I became so good at blocking out the rest of the world that I would drive others nuts because I wouldn't hear them talking to me while I was focused on the limited world I saw through the viewfinder. So while I was focused on my role as a victim, I wasn't seeing or experiencing the opportunities that were coming my way. New relationships with great potential came and went, and my heart was in pain because I wasn't allowing my love to flow.

Because our natural condition is a loving one, when we do not love, we feel pain. By staying consciously aware of the source of our love, we are able to access this love; and when we are loving, there is less fear, and where there is less fear, there is usually less pain.

When we are able to love ourselves and embrace our darkness, we are then able to be with others in a compassionate way because we are more likely to love them and be able to embrace their darkness as well.

I have found that I have a great ability to attract people into my life who mirror my own thoughts and feelings. When I communicate with others, it becomes easier for me to see myself in others. I have certain tendencies which, if left unchecked, would look exactly like some of the qualities of people whom I meet and am at odds with.

I know a number of individuals who expect great results but don't really put in a lot of effort. Some complain about how much they work, and others don't like doing ordinary things that take a lot of time. I can identify with each of these people because through their hearts, I can feel my own. There were times in my career as a photographer when I hated to have to make appointments and show my portfolio to people, and there were times when I hated calling people back after I'd seen them. Almost every challenge others confront when they're working for themselves I've also had to face in my life and career.

These issues are universal, so as I clear them up, it shows others that they can do so as well. As they see and feel that my own faith works, the faith and belief of others gets stronger.

Once there's a crack in the container that holds the love, it's an opening for the erosion of faith. I think that everyone at some time or another experiences doubt—about themselves, their abilities, and the work they're doing. I have certainly experienced this myself. Keeping focused at all times is a challenge for everyone I've ever met, and when doubt creeps into our hearts, we can get way off track if we're not careful.

I've heard many successful entrepreneurs state that it's not a good idea to put all one's eggs in the proverbial basket, so I can appreciate that people can have different viewpoints, and different ways of going about things. Some people excel when they stay singularly focused on doing one thing. Other people excel with diversity. The only rule here is that there are no rules. I know many people who constantly look for new conquests, and others who strive for perfection in one area. There is no right or wrong.

Key #7: Clear, focused attention has a lot of power.

As for me, I enjoy experiencing focused energy, when I receive it and when I'm the one sharing it. Relationships grow closer when each person is able to be totally present for the other; and when we're fortunate enough to share moments like these with loved ones, our need to have more people in our lives diminishes. That's why so many new lovers like to be alone. They wish to experience the whole of creation with and through each other.

When I'm with my four kids, totally present, I don't wonder what it would be like to have more kids around. At those times, it's as if they are my whole world. What happens is that the experience is so joyous that we seem to attract others into our energy field.

Imagine that you only have one person in your life, which is something that just about all of us have experienced at one time or another, if only for a short while. If you were to completely focus all your love and attention on that relationship, and completely nourish this other person and honor them 100 percent (and this might mean leaving them a lot of space), chances are that the wonderful vibration of this relationship would attract others to you. At the same time, if you developed a frustrating relationship with this person, you would probably attract more of the same. By loving, we attract more love. By being free and powerful ourselves, we attract free and powerful people into our lives.

As we all grow through the archetypal patterns of relationships, and as we learn more about ourselves in relation to each other, we make it easier for all those who follow.

All our cells are connected, all our thoughts are connected, all our feelings are connected within ourselves, and as my energy reaches out to embrace yours, we are connected. Two people sharing a lot of intimate time together become a collective force.

When your energy melts with someone to co-create a business or to just share an event or a life, everything appears magnified. I remember the feeling of having dozens of people all focused on creating a great photograph, and how we were all connected through the process. Their success became mine, and I felt as if I were a part of their lives, too.

Key #8: Our Unity and Connection has Power

Daryl Kollman, the founder and president of a company I was once involved with, said that his distributors were his arms and his legs. He was experiencing these people as extensions of himself. Managers or coaches of a team can experience the same thing: the players are extensions of their energy, and while the players are out on the field, they're acting out their ideas.

We're all an extension of Divine energy, and we're all connected to each other through our Source. As one of us grows, the whole collective ocean of our consciousness expands, and we are able to experience this expansion. When all the strings of a guitar are strummed, only the most trained ear can differentiate the sound of each individual string. Out of the entire symphony of thoughts created by humanity, some thoughts reach out more than others, but we are all part of this creation.

While I was going through the breakup of my marriage, I was experiencing massive pain, and I've come to understand that it wasn't just my pain I was experiencing, but the collective pain of all my brothers throughout the world going through similar situations. As I tried to convince my wife that there was a better way, I felt great resistance, and I was experiencing the collective resistance of all the women everywhere who felt the need to start new lives and who didn't want to stay in their marriages.

As we experience our issues through our relationships, it's important that we not think of ourselves as being alone. Sometimes what we feel is our connection to the total pool of energy in which we live. If we learn to rejoice in the success of our friends rather than be envious, we will be acknowledging our own capacity for success.

There exists an enormous reservoir of love out of which we were all created and to which we are able to return when we remember the path we're on. It is from being in this pool that we know that love is unlimited, that it is always there for us, and that the more we drink from it, the more we contribute to it. This is the source of all abundance of any sort, and the spiritual laws that govern one aspect of our lives works in sync with all the other aspects as well.

When someone or something is in a relationship that is harmonious with universal laws, there is no limit to what can be accomplished. Divine energy is a totally inexhaustible source of nutrition for body, mind,

and soul; and as long we collectively respect this concept, love and support will always be available when needed.

Key #9: Respect for Others-See the Divinity in Others

If you learn to respect each person and thing in your life as an aspect of the Divine, your relationships will flourish, and you will flourish. There is no limit to how many people you can touch with your love. Only conditional love has limits, but if you open yourself to experience unconditional love, you will also open yourself to unconditional growth.

We have learned conditional love from other humans, because at no time does Divine energy come to us in a conditional manner. True spirit has no bounds and knows no limits. One of the biggest gifts we can give ourselves as well as others is to share our love; and as we open our hearts, the hearts of all others will open.

Global transformation starts with personal transformation, and when we are nourished with love, we grow quickly. We can then share this with others and grow together. Not only is our relationship with ourselves and others of vital importance if we want to grow a big business, for example, but our relationship to the earth and all this implies plays a key part in our growth process.

As a result of all the information that is now available about responsible global stewardship, I have grown in awareness to a greater extent. I have come to accept that our lives are determined as much by what we choose to do as by what we choose *not* to do.

By not taking certain action steps in my personal life concerning the well being of our planet, I was not living in harmony with the spiritual laws I so respect. By not living in harmony with these laws, I was stunting my own growth; and my relationship with our planet was not nearly as meaningful as it could have been. As I paid more attention to what was going on in my world, though, I realized that the more responsibility I assumed about caring for the planet, the more I felt nourished by it; and the more I felt connected to Earth, the environment, and God.

When I feel more connected to my Creator, the quality of my entire life improves.

We all have love inside of us, even though there are some of us who have challenges when it comes to feeling and expressing this love. Right livelihood is something that can be totally transformational in our search for inner excellence, and our relationship with our work is as vital as our relationship with our spouse. Depending on our level of commitment and involvement with either, we can feel more or less fulfilled.

I have always felt totally fulfilled in relation to my children, and that's because I fully invest my heart with them. I have never felt that I had to sacrifice anything for my kids. They have been a constant joy in my life, always giving me a wonderful feeling that adds immeasurably to my existence.

Key #10: Total Engagement with Your Higher Self

Someone's higher self is always going to know when your higher self is not fully engaged. When you meet couples who are deeply connected and totally engaged, it's quite mesmerizing. It often makes people feel that they'd like to have an expression of love that is similar.

I saw a T-shirt in the Albuquerque airport one day while waiting for my luggage that said:

"The most valuable possession you can own is an open heart. The most powerful weapon you can be is an instrument of peace." — **Carlos Santana**

I feel that there's a Divine presence that is the Source of absolutely everything, and exists in everything, and I want to exist in a place where this Presence, which permeates all, is obvious to everyone. By opening our hearts and letting the love flow freely, we are in constant communication with this Divine energy, which supports not only the individual but also the entire world. Just like the ocean exists in every drop that makes it up, the Divine exists in every heart that makes up our world.

Love knows no limits, and through knowing love, we can taste the Divine, because once we have the experience of accepting, we can make the step to accept other things greater than ourselves. We don't need to be limited by our rational minds, but can attain knowledge via the heart, which is the path of the great mystics.

This feeling of completeness creates a joyful feeling of exhilaration, and when action springs forth from this condition, it is usually very productive.

Now that I'm in a more joyous state, I seem to draw *happier* people to me. What I desire now is to attract those who haven't lost their yearning for enlightenment, and who want to make a difference in the world. People want their lives to have meaning, they want to leave a legacy of having made a difference, they want to feel that their lives have some value—in *their* eyes and in the eyes of others. It is through serving others that we can feel a connection with God and have a sense of being more than just a statistic.

By reaching out and helping others, we satisfy one of our greatest needs: the need to feel connected. With all the divorces occurring worldwide, families aren't staying together as they did in the old days, and as people spend more and more time in front of their computers, they experience friendship through social media in lieu of physical connection—and I am as much to blame as anyone. I'm still working hard on being present for those I draw into my life. Sometimes because I'm doing so many things at once, I feel that I'm not available for some of the people who might need more information and commitment from me.

I look deeper now when I enter into a new relationship with people, and if I feel any resistance from either their side or mine, I become more careful about making any commitments. I want to spend most of my time with people who have open hearts and open minds, because these people seem to be more connected to Divine energy, and I find these to be the most enlightening and empowering relationships. I am now attracted to people who want to do things for themselves, and who truly wish to co-create

rather than having others do things for them. I still love helping people and am committed to always doing so, so I have come to the realization that the more I help strong people, the greater number of lives will be touched in a positive way.

All of the keys above were given to me through my spiritual teacher. Below is some of his wisdom. Open your heart, let your mind rest, and take in the deeply beautiful wisdom and love.

Wisdom from my guide, Sidi

Following are some excerpts from some of Sidi's teachings relating to being connected in relationships; This one is called the *Beloveds of Allah*:

I want to speak about the prophets and the father of the light and how all the prophets lived with their wives. Listen with the ear of your heart, my sons and my daughters, to hear what I say because this is a very important subject. This is from the order of God to speak to you about how to live with a husband and wife as beloveds of God.

I have given you many subjects before to help you to know yourself, to find the key to open the hidden treasure inside you. After you have walked in the way and lifted the veils of darkness to see the light of God, He brings you a step higher to see Him in the face of your beloved. The understanding of God and all that His love means to you is completed by the sharing of the deep secret love with another because it is putting the essence of all the teachings, all the books, all the sciences, and all that God has given to you into manifestation through the love you share with your beloved. Everything before has been a preparation for seeing the light of God in the eye of your beloved. You have cut through many stones in your way for the world is full of darkness and troubles and many things have come before you. But it is necessary to erase everything and to leave your past behind, to come to your beloved with a clean heart in order to live in the heart of God. He wants to show you the true picture of Himself in the face of your beloved, and it is necessary to be careful with those whom God gives us to care about because they are really the jewel. Their hearts are pure and clean and through them you can see the true image of God. You share a love whose depths cannot be fathomed because it is the love of God. His secret is in the love. It is important for you to care for your beloved as if you were caring for God, and to speak to your beloved as if you were speaking to God. At every moment you stand facing God and God is your Beloved.

*You must be polite with your beloved and give your whole self to this love. Sometimes God manifests through your beloved as the *jamal* (beauty), and sometimes as *jahal* (severity). He who cannot accept both is not in the unity, because He is manifesting what He wants you to see of Himself. Give the love to your beloved, and it will change the darkness to the light, the *jahal* to a garden of love.*

Care for your beloved. Make each word and action contain only the love of God and His polite. Understand what God wants from you in every minute. What He wants is for you to be the father and the mother, sister and brother, wife and husband to your beloved, to be everything at any

time. Do not search for your beloved in any other place because he holds all the qualities of God. And you also are the beloved of God. There is no separation between you because you both carry the soul of God. He does not make a difference between her and him, and she does not make a difference between him and her. They are one. There are no numbers in the truth. From the picture I have given you, and from the religion of your soul, the soul of God and of the guide, send mercy to your beloved because in this giving you are sending mercy for yourself.

Life in the marriage of beloveds is for each to be holy, and to care about one another. This marriage is like a holy tree whose roots grow deep into the earth, and the earth is the heart of God. How do you nourish this tree? You nourish it by giving it love and clean water—water that has been cleansed of all the troubles of this world. It is necessary for the tree to grow strong in order to give shade to all the lovers of God who are beneath it. When nourished, her roots will grow deep into the earth, becoming all the qualities of God, covering the universe with His essence. This is the Tree of Life and it is necessary for it to be nourished with the love of God. Then it will give the holiest of fruits with His permission and have the sweetest flowers, because it comes from one source.

Surround her with love and clean water. How do you do this? By helping each other, in the way, to remove all obstacles that come before you, and letting nothing stand in the way of this love. The heart of your beloved is like a glass, and it is necessary to take care of it so that it will not break. When it breaks, you have broken yourself; you have misused its care. Then God will take you from His garden.

The heart of a beloved is a jewel, and there are responsibilities for caring for this heart. Your time together as beloveds has three parts: The first part is to yourself, the second to your wife or husband, and the third part for your children. From all this you can give to your mother, father, sisters and brothers. All of these parts are for God. If you walk straight and you give your whole self for the love of God, He will give you a life of happiness and peace. What more could you want?

The husband is like the father of the universe but first he begins in the home. His example is like the earth, which anyone can walk upon and take what they want. Its soil is the ground of love. He stands strong as the source of love and understanding in the family, and behind the strength is all the mercy of Allah. God has made him a captain of a ship to provide for the family. His wife can come to him at any time, and he gives her the love and the caring of God. He is the support and strength of the family, maintaining the home in balance.

The way of every prophet has been to help his wife, not making a difference between him and her. She is his equal. The Father of the Light, our Prophet Muhammad, may Allah bless him and send him peace, helped his wife with everything. He cleaned, cooked, sewed, brought water from the well, coal for the fire, and played with his children at home. This was the way of every prophet.

God says, "Know that your wife is your mirror, and through her reflection you can see yourself. If she remains in your heart, you can see Me through the eye of your heart, but only if you care for this heart and send her love."

Yes, my son, when your work is finished, and if she has not finished it is necessary to help with what is needed. The responsibility of a husband is great. He must provide love where love is needed, and help without being asked; keep peace in the family, and know that there is no kingship in being a captain. The wife is not a servant for her husband, nor the husband for the wife—both are slaves for Allah. If God is your beloved, then you are slaves for each other. If you treat her as a jewel and appreciate everything that is done as if it were coming from the Hand of God, then she will be happy and not turn outside. She will keep the home as a loving garden.

The wife is the mother. Not only are her family her children, all the world are her children. She is a fountain of love, showering the world with her water. Its source is a deep spring flowing directly from God. She has the love to give without asking anything in return and without holding anything back, because her giving has no end. She knows that the caring for her family is the expression of her love for God, and anyone can come to her at any time. She gives patience and understanding without end. Her home is kept as a place of beauty, and food is prepared as if her Lord were a guest for dinner. She is the most precious of jewels; she must only open the jewel inside her. The jewel is hidden within in the deepest valley, holding all the wisdom and the love of God. If she reaches this valley, she will know the meaning of the love she gives.

When she speaks with her husband, she must know that she is speaking with God, and that every word is a prayer. It is the same for him because everyone is the face of God. If anyone is not polite with this reflection, then he is not polite with God. If a husband feels that his home is a garden with a loving wife, then he will not turn outside; he will feel peace and happiness in his heart.

It is necessary for every child born from this holy marriage to see only light from the beginning and to grow up in a happy home full of love. Teach him the meaning of courtesy; teach him politeness towards his mother and father, and do not leave him to follow his own impulse, but guide him in everything. If he is left to follow his own impulses, he will feel the troubles of the darkness. God will ask both the parents why the child was left on his own. It is also from this message to not give the child, after he or she has grown up, to anyone who is not from the family of God. Others do not know the meaning of politeness in the same way.

In the religion of God, the woman is like a jewel, and it is necessary for the man to drink from the cup of her wine, because its essence is the deep secret love of God.

My sons and daughters, if you knew what God has given to you, you would not do or say anything to break the heart of your beloved. The key to living a life with a beloved is to give each other what each needs. I am sure that if everyone does all that I have said, he will live this day in the garden, and feel peace in any place and in any religion. This message knows no difference

between people or religion. There is no life like this life because you live all the time with God, and pray all your time with God.

I send my voice to all the world and carry everyone in my heart. La ilaha'ilallah. (There is no God but one God.)

I think you can see from this teaching that to apply these kinds of truths to your daily life, you must feel truly connected to God, your partner, and your family. When you give love to them; that is also what you would like to have from them. As you open your heart in giving, you create a pathway for them to enter into your innermost being.

Exercises to create Healthy Divine Relationships

“I have given you many subjects before to help you to know yourself, to find the key to open the hidden treasure inside you” – Beloveds of Allah, Sidi al-Jamal

1. Aligning with Divine Relationships –

Make a list of the most important relationships you would like to improve upon. This could be names of people, groups, things. (ie. Spouse, kids, family, boss, job, a cause, education, etc.) Then, place a number next to each based on your level of commitment. 10 being high, 1 being low.

2. What action steps can you take to raise the lower numbered relationships? Refer to the keys above and allow your heart to guide you. Which ones stand out to you or which one(s) draw you in? Commit to working on one the most important relationships first, starting today. State your action steps clearly. Remember that this is about setting intention and taking action. 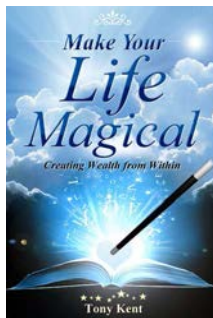
